### **1. TNA stations status**

The TNA leaders reported about the status of their installations.

All TNAs except SRT are on track or even overachieving their goals.

I. Rottmann reported about the withdrawal of SRT from the beginning of the project. This resulted in a budget surplus of 101.132,75€ that has to be redistributed. In a consultation, the project officer indicated that the best solution would be to distribute this remaining budget in equal parts among the facilities with no open access policy (LOFAR, IRAM PV, IRAM NOEMA, APEX). The TNA leaders agreed in following the proposal of the project officer.

R. Neri reported that due to an upgrade, the former IRAM PdBI is from now on called IRAM NOEMA.

I. Rottmann asked the TNA leaders to claim more than contractually necessary in PR3; at least 150%. In the beginning of 2016, it will be known, if there is remaining budget. If yes, it could be used to reimburse extra access hours, as those costs have been made during the duration of the project.

### **2. TNA travel budget**

Regarding the travel budget, A. van den Poll reported under spending. Only few claims came in.

The TNA leaders agreed that the first priority of spending the TNA travel budget is given to the users. The TNA leaders projected their expenses for travelling; result 14.000€ under spending.

This amount will be distributed for supporting PC meetings of:

- EVN: 7.000€
- LOFAR: 2.000€
- Effelsberg: 2.000€
- IRAM: 3.000€

In case of under spending at the end of the project, more support for the PC meetings from 2014 and 2015 will be provided.

It was made clear that all travel claims have to arrive at A. van den Poll the latest on October 31, 2015. Otherwise, they cannot be posted and processed anymore, and will be ignored. This will allow to define the TNA travel budget left and to claim the former PC costs on it.

### 3. PR2 feedback

The periodic report 2 was submitted on August 29, 2014. Regarding the financial report, all claimed expenses were accepted, with only small budget deductions. The payment letter is expected by Nov 9, 2014.

No official comment has been received yet to the scientific report.

### 4. Open discussion

**Questionnaires:** In total, the Management received 81 questionnaires (online submission to the EC was also confirmed):

The management (and probably the EC) has still not received questionnaires from WSRT and LOFAR; only five from e-Merlin, and one from APEX. The TNA leaders agreed again in explaining the users the importance of these questionnaires. For this purpose, the TNA explanation sheet with the request for the questionnaire submission will be attached to these minutes.

→ **A1/2014-10-21:** JCI will provide R. Neri with a list of the project acronyms of the received questionnaires. He will cross check, which projects have not sent a questionnaire.

→ **A2/2014-10-21:** JCI will ask the IRAM users that submitted the questionnaire, if she is authorized to tell R. Neri the average rating of IRAM/some general information about the evaluation of the IRAM performance.

### 5. Horizon2020

The call's text for the Work programme 2016/2017 will be written in Q1/2015, the first calls released in Q4/2015. The earliest possible starting date for the next RadioNet would be Q4/2016. This means RadioNet has to bridge a gap of approximately one year.

The call for infrastructures will request future technical and research development of the existing research infrastructures. The infrastructures should be a complement not a duplication of the SKA and all projects are requested to offer open access.

It is important to ensure that the lobbying for RadioNet comes from all possible directions. As many ministries as possible should be involved, especially those from the UK, France, and the Netherlands. For the purpose of this lobbying, the RadioNet3 Management prepared a RadioNet factsheet, which will be distributed to the Board members.

## **6. AOB**

### **RP3:**

- Beginning of 2015, I. Rottmann will ask the TNA administrative contact persons to calculate the real access costs for the past years 2012-2014; to minimize the work at the final reporting.
- In the PR3 report, the highlights of TNAs should be reported.
- The management will provide detailed structure and explanations for the final report.

**Extension:** I. Rottmann made clear that there will be no extension of RadioNet3.

**News:** I. Rottmann encouraged the TNA leaders to provide the management with more news about their activities and the results. RadioNet3 would post this news on the webpage and the RadioNet3 newsletter. Until now, already two press releases from RadioNet3 have been published on the EC webpage Research & Innovation:
